



Accomplishments 2004-2010



Phase I - Creekwalk

- 0.4 mile stonedust/asphalt handicapped accessible creek side trail surface from trail head to Russell Street
- Trail head park entrance with

information kiosk, trail side amenities - benches, bike racks, pet stations, waste receptacles

- Direct fisherman access into Chittenango Creek, and handicap accessible fishing platform.
- Sidewalk connection to the Town of Sullivan Park and Neighborhood Trails



South Webber/Forbes Ave. Neighborhood Trail

- A stonedust surfaced trail linking residential developments on the western edge of the community to Sullivan Park.
- Bicycle and pedestrian access to park facilities, Chittenango Central School property, the Creekwalk and village center.

Next Steps

Trail development will be concentrated between Chittenango Creek and Dyke Road, linking the southern residential developments to the Village center.

The work is made possible through collaboration with the Chittenango Lions Club and a grant from the NYS Office



of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, with a focus on conservation and showcasing the natural flood

plain habitat.

This area will include:

- 10 acre botanical park setting with a diverse horticultural collection
- Approximately 1 mile of stonedust surfaced, handicap accessible trail
- Accessible parking and improved fishing access.
- Trail amenities, including benches, bike racks, pet stations, waste receptacles, interpretive signage, with opportunities for naming.

Future Steps



- Connect to: Chittenango Landing Canalboat Museum and Old Erie Canal State Park
- Improve fishing access

- Improve streambank conditions through storm water management
- Collaborate with landowners to help make Phase II and Phase III of Creekwalk possible.
- Strengthen neighborhood connectivity, while improving economic vitality of downtown businesses.
- Facilitate educational enrichment and appreciation for the community's natural and built environment.
